There's been a lot of discussion recently about how Blayney will benefit if the McPhillamys project goes ahead.

We have a constant stream of people asking about work and training opportunities; and local business people are also keen to find out how they can benefit from the project.

Jobs and training opportunities

At least 350 jobs would be created during the 12-18 month construction period—building the plant, pipeline, roads, admin buildings etc to get the mine up and running. Once mining starts, another 300 jobs would be created in operations.

We plan to recruit locally to fill as many positions as possible for construction and operations because we want local people to benefit from McPhillamys.

A boost for Blayney

Blayney businesses will also receive a boost, with new jobs created by demand for goods and services from people working at the mine. There will be many opportunities for businesses such as those providing food, accommodation, equipment, fuel, machinery, administration and many other services.

Working with business

We're already working with local businesses on some important initiatives. One example is the work we're doing with Council and local tourism bodies to manage demand for accommodation around tourism events.

Another is the discussions we're having with TAFE and training providers to develop skills and training opportunities for school leavers and unemployed people.
